CPAH'S IMPACT

As the only comprehensive, full-service housing organization in the northern suburbs, CPAH is recognized nationally for innovation and impact and has become the region's go-to resource for housing services. Each year, CPAH helps thousands of individuals and families achieve housing stability, build wealth, and strengthen communities as follows:

- **250+** households per year prepare for successful and responsible homeownership through HUD-Certified housing counseling and education programs.
- **30** households per year achieve the stability and wealth-building benefits of homeownership through down payment assistance programs.
- **125+** households per year have stable housing and increased financial well-being through community land trust & inclusionary housing homeownership programs.
- **1,325** households per year have safe, stable, and affordable housing in CPAH's inventory of rental housing and through its inclusionary housing rental programs.
- **30** households per year avoid homelessness and maintain safe, stable housing as a result of rental assistance programs.
- **40** households per year receive forgivable loans and construction management services to make their homes safe, healthy, and accessible.
- **100** households per year have increased financial knowledge, skills, and behaviors as a result of CPAH's financial capability programs.
- **75** households per year avoid the devastating impacts that foreclosures have on families and communities through CPAH's foreclosure prevention program.
- **5-10** distressed homes are acquired, rehabilitated, and resold each year, strengthening neighborhoods and providing quality affordable housing for low-income households.

CPAH has helped develop or preserve over 1,750 units of affordable housing and provided housing-related services for over 75,000 residents

LOOKING AHEAD

CPAH has an exciting and ambitious year ahead, and the Senior Director of Philanthropy will play a critical role in advancing and amplifying this work. CPAH is currently completing construction of a 34-unit senior housing development in Libertyville, building a townhome community in Highland Park, getting ready to start construction of a 40-unit senior cottage project in Beach Park, planning its first Permanent Supportive Housing development, and will be launching a new regional affordable housing Hub to further expand its impact in the community.

The ideal candidate will have a strong background in nonprofit fundraising, excellent communication skills, and a proven track record of successful grant writing and building relationships with corporate and foundation partners.

Reporting to the President, the Senior Director of Philanthropy will be deeply committed to creating a collaborative culture of philanthropy at CPAH. This leader will also develop processes and policies that consistently monitor progress and donor engagement. In addition to working closely with the President, the Senior Director of Philanthropy will frequently partner and strategize with the Vice President of Community Relations and a highly engaged Board.

KEYS RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

- Develop, manage, and implement a comprehensive fundraising program with emphasis on increasing revenue through corporations, foundations, and major gifts.
- Identify, cultivate, and maintain new and existing relationships with corporate partners and foundations.
- Research and write grant proposals, ensuring timely submission and follow-up.
- Work closely with the President and Board of Directors to build relationships with donors and train the Board to make successful solicitations and open doors to prospective donors.
- Fully utilize donor management software and other tools to identify prospects, track donations, analyze fundraising data, manage relationships, and track progress towards goals.
- Support the Vice President of Community Relations in coordinating special events.
- Sustain a philanthropic spirit among board members, donors, staff, and other stakeholders.

- Minimum of 5 years of experience in nonprofit fundraising, with a proven track record of securing 5-6 figure gifts and grants from corporations and foundations.
- Experience in the development and management of fundraising programs, including donor solicitation strategy, communications, donor selection and appreciation, and special events.
- Proven ability to successfully write grants.
- Ability to develop and maintain relationships with a diverse group of donors and stakeholders, including clients and communities served.
- Must be self-motivated, results oriented, persistent, and able to set priorities and work on numerous projects simultaneously.
- Proficient computer skills and ability to manage fundraising database programs.
- Exceptional interpersonal and communication skills, both written and verbal.
- Demonstrate and support a culture of diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility.

COMPENSATION, WORK ENVIRONMENT & BENEFITS

Salary is competitive and commensurate with experience. The salary range for this role is \$100,000 - \$115,000 with a generous benefits package.

This is a full-time position. Standard office hours are 8:30am-4:30pm. CPAH staff frequently work in the office 3 days per week and remotely 2 days per week. Flexibility is available regarding hours and hybrid schedule.

Benefits include medical, dental, vision, disability, life, healthcare reimbursement arrangement (HRA), and matched 401K contributions up to 5% of salary. Paid time off, plus 3 floating holidays of the employee's choice as well as 11 federal holidays. Sick time is also earned at 9 days per year.
